Please help keep our lake clean

This article was originally run in July of 2017. Because of the importance of the subject, we wanted to run it again. Banded Mystery Snails remian a serious concern for our lake. It is very important to pick them out of the lake and put them into a burn pile.

Recently I received information from the University of MN about invasive species in our lakes. About two years ago I noticed that we were seeing a lot of snails in



Lake Eshquaguma. I have also asked friends who live on other lakes if they had noticed the problem. That's when I contacted the U of M. They sent me several pamphlets about several different invasive species invading our lakes.

In particular, it is the Banded Mystery Snail that is the big problem in the lakes, brought in by boats not cleaned properly and other ways, too.

These snails can form dense populations and outcompete native species for food and habitat in lakes and streams. They are intermediate hosts for parasitic worms and can transmit trematodes that kill waterfowl and prey on fish embryos. Shells often litter shorelines and clog screens of water intakes.

Eradicating mystery snails is nearly impossible. Your actions and your help can help prevent new infestations and are vital for preventing their spread.

As often as possible take a pail to the lake and pick up as many as you can see, daily, if possible. Take them from the lake and put into a burn pile or somewhere else where they can die. They can live several days out of the water.

John Staver 1926-2018

John Staver died peacefully at the Essentia Heath Viginia Care Center from complications of Parkinson's disease, on Wednesday, June 20, 2018.

John was born in Virginia, Minnesota, on November 20, 1926 and attended Virginia High School graduating in 1945. He served in the US Army from 1944-1945. He then attended the University of Minnesota graduating in 1950.

John worked at Staver Foundry for over 50 years and had some ownership in a number of local businesses during those years. Bearing Service and Supply, Taconite Tire, Minnesota Alloy and Wild Rice Inc. He owned, with the Bombardier Corp, Performance Products Corp, distributing Ski-Doo oil in the US and Canada. He also had a major interest in several graphite golf shaft makers during the 1970's and 1980"s.

He was an expert on the Rules of Golf. He lectured at many USGA/ PGA Rules seminars throughout the US, officiating at 25 US Opens, 25 Senior US Opens as well as 5 Masters Tournaments. He served on the Rules of Golf Committee, the Implement and Ball Committee and the Green Committee of the United States Golf Association throughout the years.

John hit golf balls in 10 decades beginning in the 1920's, winning local golf events through the years. He was a passionate supporter of walking and carrying his bag over the use of golf carts.

Shooting 71 at Northland Country Club at the age of 75 while carrying his bag, shooting a Hole in One at the 12th Hole at Augusta and his ability to tear a deck of playing cards into eighths well into his 70's were the things that he was most proud of.

During his lifetime he was a member of many national and international golf clubs. At the time of his death he was an honorary member of the PGA National Club, Northland Country Club and Eshquaguma Country Club. He served as president of the Virginia Golf Club, Eshquaguma Country Club, and Tryall Golf Course in Jamaica. John was the club champion nine times at Eshquaguma Country Club.

John was an avid wine connoisseur and in 1984 was elected Grand Pilier Generaux of the Chevalier du Tastevin, a French wine society for the United

He was preceded in death by his parents, Byron and Doris Staver, son Byron "Fub" Staver and sister Gretel Haglin.

John is survived by his wife Sue, daughters Gayl Staver and Kyle Staver, step-daughters Jodi Perlman and Cheryl Hanson, grandchildren Katrina, Michael, Tara, Staver, Jacob and Olivia.

Editor's note: John Staver won nine ECC Men's Championships spanning four decades – starting in the 50s when he was 28 – to the 80s when he was 61. The DNR expects to have some preliminary data to share later this summer but the more complete write-up won't happen until winter and then the survey will be published on lake finder on the MNDNR website.

ECC Membership Survey


Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the ECC Membership Survey in April. We received 100 survey responses. The Board has reviewed the results and comments and we are making plans that will address many of your concerns.

Specifically, in the Pro-shop we are continuing to search for non-apparel merchandise, different clothing styles and price points with the intent of providing more purchasing options for members.

The golf course is a major concern. Our ECC grounds crew has been working hard to reseed, fertilize, water and help the course rebound after the winter kill that affected ECC and major other courses in the Northland.
