#### **USGA** Rule Changes

Please stop by and take a minute to look at the 2016 USGA Rules of Golf Book. There are a few changes to the rules. The most talked about is **Anchoring the Club**. A new Rule is introduced to prohibit anchoring the club, either "directly" or by use of an "anchor point" during the making of a stroke. There is a poster in the Pro Shop that helps explain "anchoring".

#### **Posting your Handicap**

When posting your score for GHIN handicap, your round must be witnessed. Taken from the USGA website - "As long as someone accompanies the player during the round (e.g., fellow competitor, opponent, caddie, marker for a tournament, friend riding along in a cart) the player is not playing alone."

How many holes can a player play alone to post the score? The player must be accompanied for at least seven holes for a nine-hole score or 13 holes for 18-hole score. This is consistent with Section 5-1 and the minimum number of holes played under the Rules of Golf.

#### Take Note . . .

A few things to remember while you are enjoying your play here at ECC:

After leaving the cart path we ask that you scatter. Keep motorized golf carts off the fairways as much as possible, use the rough for cart travel and remember that ECC does ask that you use the 90° rule to cross the fairways,


Please adhere to the rule of one motorized cart per two players; foursomes are not to use more than two carts.

#### Did you know . . .

In 1618 the feather golf ball or 'Featherie' was introduced. This was a handcrafted ball made with goose feathers tightly packed into a horse or cow hide sphere. The feathers and leather were fashioned into a ball while wet. As the assembly dried out the leather shrank and the feathers expanded to create a hardened ball. The ball was then finished off by painting it and punched with the ball-makers mark. Quality varied according to the skill of the craftsman. Unfortunately, the handcrafted nature of the balls meant that they were priced beyond the pockets of the masses, sometimes more expensive than a club.

#### Intermediate & advanced tennis to be offered again this summer
