The certificate that accompanied the flags stated: "This is to certify that the accompanying flags were flown over the United States Capitol on July 2, 2015.

At the request of the Honorable Richard M. Nolan, Member of Congress, this flag was flown to commemorate the Eshquaguma Country Club Centennial. Founded in 1915 Eshquaguma Country Club celebrates its centennial in 2015. The oldest golf course north of Duluth continues to celebrate promoting and contributing to the strength, vitality and stability of the Iron Range."

They would have a very short life expectancy if they were used every day. The plan is to fly the flags only on special occasions such as July 4, Labor Day and Memorial Day.

ECC Stock Certificates

In 1915 when Eshquaguma Club Inc. was incorporated, shares of stock were issued to investors to establish ownership. Now 100 years later, during this centennial year, we thought it might be fun to treat corporate members with a share. The certificate has been redesigned and one share will be issued to each corporate member. Although

- The last day the pro shop is open this fall is October 11th.


